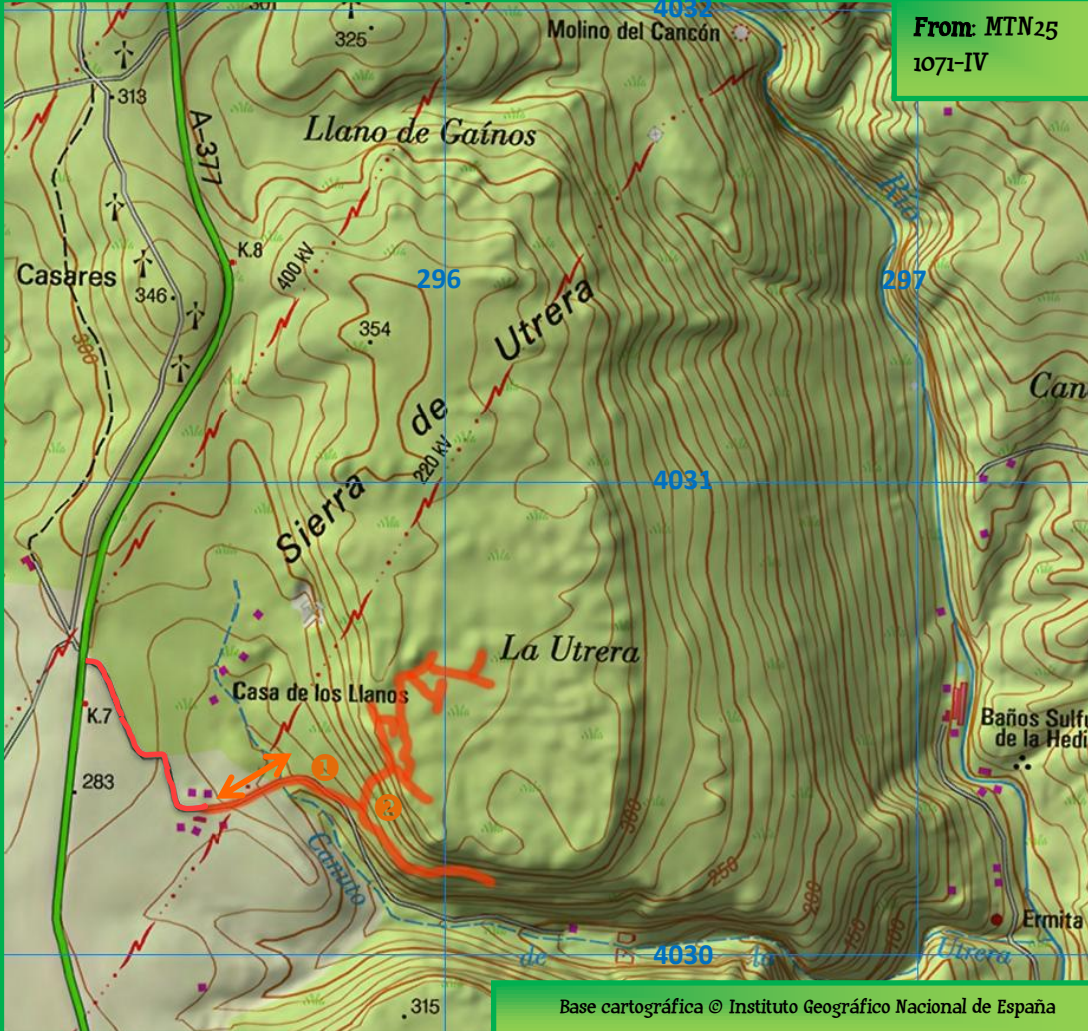




Fantastic Forms of the Meseta

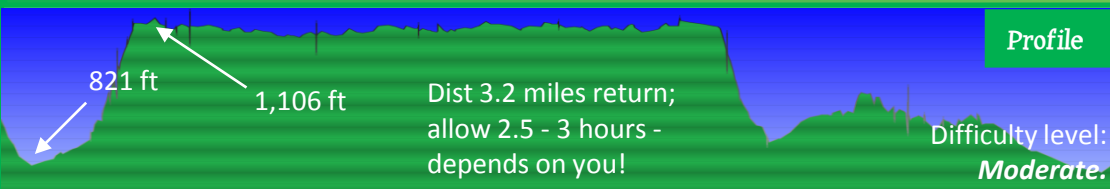

Conditions: short distance, uneven surfaces, a steep rough incline to the plateau, narrow path and dense vegetation in places.

- 1 Turn left at 30 S 295723 4030367 along a path that climbs along the side of the gorge.
- 2 Turn left at 30 S 295829 4030305 along a rough path that climbs up to the plateau.



This route explores a small part of the karst plateau of **La Utrera** known as Los Canchos, an area of Jurassic limestone carved into weird shapes by the action of wind and rain. The route starts at the main A-377 road and takes a small path that climbs up the left side of the canyon. It soon branches off to the left where there is a fainter track with a steep rough incline. This is waymarked with the colour blue. Once at the plateau, there are many paths to explore. The route comes down the same way, but turns left to follow the path for a distance up the side of the gorge before returning to the start point. The route is covered by the [Birding Map](#) of the area, by BioGea.
