



Welcome to Casares Walks



This is the town of Casares. It's a fascinating place to visit : a classic "white village" in the traditional Moorish style, with houses rising up the side of the crag, and labyrinthine streets connecting them. Download the [booklet](#) to discover the full magic of this place : its history, its monuments (some dating back to the Romans and even before), its architecture, its traditions, its fiestas (see for example this [video](#)), its song, its dance, its friendly and welcoming people . . . and its spectacular scenery, mountains, beaches, rivers, flora and fauna. From the peak of Los Reales at 4,764 feet, the District of Casares runs south 7 miles to sea level at the Bay of Casares, and 8 miles southwest to the rivers Genal and Guadiaro. Some of the geology comes from the ancient seabed; some from volcanic action long ago. The result is a diversity of landscapes which play host to a rich variety of birds, animals, trees, and flowers.

The 20+ self-guided walks in this website give you the opportunity to experience the world of Casares through a range of themes and landscapes. You can explore the town; visit Roman buildings; follow a pilgrim route; stand on the highest point in the District; walk down from the town to the sea; explore the jagged scenery of the Sierra Crestellina or the fantastic shapes carved from wind and rain in the Sierra Utrera; travel through Mediterranean woodland; walk alongside the orange groves of the rivers Genal and Guadiaro; and pass by water mills built by the Moors.
